



# WHY CHOOSE A CAREER AS A HEAVY EQUIPMENT OPERATOR?

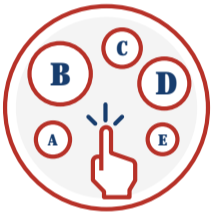
## About the Heavy Equipment Industry
