THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE NOT SUBJECT TO AMENDMENT OR MODIFICATION BY ORAL AGREEMENT. I, THE UNDERSIGNED PURCHASER OF THE PROGRAM OF TRAINING, HAVE READ, UNDERSTAND AND AGREE TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED HEREIN AND WITH MY SIGNATURE I CERTIFY HAVING RECEIVED AN EXACT COPY OF THIS AGREEMENT, A COPY OF THE SCHOOL CATALOG AND SCHOOL PERFORMANCE FACT SHEET. I FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGE THAT NO VERBAL STATEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE CONTRARY TO WHAT IS CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT. **THIS ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT IS A LEGALLY BINDING INSTRUMENT WHEN SIGNED BY THE STUDENT AND ACCEPTED BY THE SCHOOL.** I understand that this is a legally binding contract. 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### C. PAYMENT METHOD

All monies must be received prior to the start of class, or satisfactory payment arrangements must be approved by HEC.

Heavy Equipment Colleges of America shall require the following maximum charges due upon enrollment:

For a program that is completed in one term or four months, Heavy Equipment Colleges of America shall require payment of all tuition and fees on the first day of instruction.

For a program designed to be longer than four months, Heavy Equipment Colleges of America shall not require more than four months of advance payment of tuition and shall provide a payment installment plan. When 50 percent of the program has been offered, Heavy Equipment Colleges of America shall require full payment.

If a Heavy Equipment Colleges of America student makes a request to provide payment in full after the student has been accepted, enrolled, and the date of the first-class session is disclosed on the enrollment agreement, Heavy Equipment Colleges of America shall accept payment in full for tuition and fees.

The limitations listed above shall not apply to any funds received by Heavy Equipment Colleges of America through federal and state student financial aid grant and loan programs, or through any other federal or state programs, if participation in any programs shall occur in the future.

#### *Definitions:*

Total charges are institutional charges and third-party fees. Third party fees are related to medical exams/vaccinations and exam/licensure fees for participation in the program, if applicable, and to meet the requirements to be eligible for entry level employment.

Heavy Equipment Colleges of America tuition means the cost per hour and does not include itemized fees such as the Registration.

### D. REFUND POLICY

#### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

1. You have the right have the right to cancel your agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first-class session or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. Applicants who have not visited the school prior to enrollment will have the opportunity to withdraw without penalty within three business days following either the regularly scheduled orientation procedures or following a tour of the school facilities and inspection of equipment where training and services are provided.

2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides notice of cancellation to any employee of Heavy Equipment Colleges of America.
4. The notice of cancellation need not take any particular form, and however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
5. If the student cancels within the Right to Cancel period, the school must refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed \$250. The school must either includes equipment, textbooks, and supplies in the refund, or provide these items to students after the Right to Cancel period. HEC will refund 100 percent of the amount paid to the student for all charges which include institutional charges, equipment, textbooks, and supplies for all student who cancel with in the Right to Cancel Period

#### WITHDRAWAL FROM THE PROGRAM

You may withdraw from the school at any time after the cancellation period (described above) and receive a pro rata refund through 60 percent of the scheduled hours in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance. The refund will be less an enrollment fee not to exceed \$100.00, and less any deduction for books or supplies not returned in new condition, within 45 days of withdrawal. If the student has completed more than 60% of the period of attendance for which the student was charged, the tuition is considered earned and the student will receive no refund.

For the purpose of determining a refund under this section, a student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from a program of instruction when any of the following occurs:

- The student notifies the institution of the student's withdrawal or as of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
- The institution terminates the student's enrollment for failure to maintain satisfactory progress; failure to abide by the rules and regulations of the institution; absences in excess of maximum set forth by the institution; and/or failure to meet financial obligations to the School.
- The student has failed to attend class for 2 days in a week.
- Failure to return from a leave of absence.

For the purpose of determining the amount of the refund, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed the last date of recorded attendance. The amount owed equals the hourly charge for the program (total institutional charge, minus non-refundable fees, divided by the number of hours in the program), multiplied by the number of hours scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal.

For programs beyond the current "payment period," if you withdraw prior to the next payment period, all charges collected for the next period will be refunded. If any portion of the tuition was paid from the proceeds of a loan or third party, the refund shall be sent to the lender, third party or, if appropriate, to the state or federal agency that guaranteed or reinsured the loan. Any amount of the refund, in excess of the unpaid balance of the loan, shall be first used to repay any student financial aid programs from which the student received benefits, in proportion to the amount of the benefits received, and any remaining amount shall be paid to the student.

If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

**UNDERSTANDINGS**

1. **Catalog:** Information about Heavy Equipment Colleges of America is published in a school catalog that contains a description of certain policies, procedures, and other information about the school. Heavy Equipment Colleges of America reserves the right to change any provision of the catalog at any time. Notice of changes will be communicated in a revised catalog, an addendum or supplement to the catalog, or other written format. 4. **NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND CREDENTIALS EARNED AT OUR INSTITUTION:** The transferability of credits you earn at Heavy Equipment Colleges of America is at the complete discretion of an institution to which you may seek to transfer. Acceptance of the certificate you earn in the Certificate of Heavy Equipment Operations program is also at the complete discretion of the institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the credits or certificate that you earn at this institution are not accepted at the institution to which you seek to transfer, you may be required to repeat some or all of your coursework at that institution. For this reason, you should make certain that your attendance at this institution will meet your educational goals. This may include contacting an institution to which you may seek to transfer after attending Heavy Equipment Colleges of America to determine if your credits or certificate will transfer.
5. **Enrollment Agreement:** All admission activities and instruction occur in English. If a prospective student is accepted for admissions based on documented English skills and his or her primary language is not English, the student has the right to obtain a clear explanation of the terms and conditions of this agreement and cancellation and refund policies in his or her primary language, at his or her expense by a translation service of his or her choosing prior to execution of the enrollment agreement.
6. **Career Services:** Placement assistance is provided. However, it is understood that the School does not and cannot promise or guarantee neither employment nor level of income or wage rate to any student or graduate.

8. **Complaints:** A student or any member of the public may file a complaint about this institution with Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education by calling 888.370.7589 toll-free or by completing a complaint form, which can be obtained on the bureau's Internet Web site, www.bppe.ca.gov.
9. **Financing:** The student understands that if a separate party is financing his/her education, that the student, and the student alone, is directly responsible for all payments and monies owed to the school listed on this agreement.
10. **Loan:** If a student is eligible for a loan guaranteed by the federal or state government and the student defaults on the loan, both of the following may occur:
  - a. The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan.
  - b. The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government assistance until the loan is repaid.
11. **Student Tuition Recovery Fund:** The State of California established the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic loss suffered by a student in an educational program at a qualifying institution, who is or was a California resident while enrolled, or was enrolled in a residency program, if the student enrolled in the institution, prepaid tuition, and suffered an economic loss.
